Conservative carbon tax proponent to speak at Georgia Tech Saturday

ATLANTA – Former Congressman Bob Inglis (R-SC), a leading conservative advocate for a government-shrinking carbon tax, will speak at Georgia Tech Saturday at the Southeast Regional Conference of [Citizens Climate Lobby](#).

During the last of his six terms in the House of Representatives, Inglis introduced the Raise Wages, Cut Carbon Act of 2009, which would have taxed the carbon content of fossil fuels and used the revenue to cut payroll taxes.

After leaving Congress in 2011, Inglis founded the [Energy and Enterprise Initiative](#), devoted to making the case with conservatives to use free enterprise to tackle climate change by enacting a revenue-neutral carbon tax and eliminating wasteful subsidies and regulations that pick winners and losers in the energy sector.
